## Introduction and purpose of this document

This document is a supplemental annex to the main document submitted to the Executive Board on "Climate and Health." It presents the performance framework for the Climate and Health strategy.

The performance framework defines the Secretariat's ambitions for its Climate and Health work and outlines the strategy's pathway to impact. It also enables the Secretariat to track progress of the strategy's implementation.

The performance framework outlines:

- The initial outputs to be delivered by mid-2025 (with further outputs to be defined as progress of the strategy advances).
- These outputs will in turn contribute to significantly advancing a set of outcomes by 2027 under each of the Strategic Objectives: 1) accelerating the introduction and adoption of climate-smart products, 2) creating systemic conditions for sustainable, equitable access, and 3) strengthening inclusive and demanddriven partnerships.
- Ultimately contributing to long-term impact in the Climate and Health space.
- Finally, the cross-cutting pillars of "Do our part" (reducing greenhouse gas emissions of the Secretariat and Unitaid's portfolio of investments) and developing and implementing a learning agenda will support and strengthen the Climate and Health strategy's implementation.



### Performance Framework for the Climate and Health Strategy

# Initial Outputs\* (to be achieved by mid-2025)

- 1. Climate and Health strategy implementation advanced and integrating lessons learned
- 2. Unitaid's capacity strengthened to implement its Climate and Health strategy
- 3. Initial portfolio of climate and health investments developed
- 4. Priority climate and health knowledge products developed and disseminated
- 5. Key partnerships established to support the Climate and Health strategy

#### **Outcomes**

(to be significantly advanced by 2027)

#### SO1: Accelerated introduction and adoption of climate-smart health products

- Increased development of climate-smart products and technologies
- Sustainable market conditions created for climate-smart products
- Climate-smart products integrated into policy and programming, supported by evidence generated through Unitaid's interventions
- Adoption of climate-smart products and care models prioritized, especially to better respond to the needs of communities affected by climate change
- Demand generated for climate-smart products
- Prioritization of locally-adapted, climate-informed interventions for development and scale-up

### SO2: Systemic conditions for sustainable, equitable access

- Relevant standards and practices adjusted to account for climate-smart considerations
- Supply chains and distribution models adapted to maximize resilience to climate and nature risks, incl. through regional manufacturing
- Critical knowledge and evidence on climatesmart products generated and disseminated

### SO3: Strengthened inclusive and demand-driven partnerships

- Communities involved in all phases of Climate and Health efforts
- Unitaid recognized as a leader in Climate and Health
- Climate action catalyzed within Unitaid's implementer network and broader partner ecosystem
- Resource mobilization opportunities enhanced

# Impact (long-term contributions)

Contribution towards several SDGs, including SDG 3 (good health and well-being) and 13 (climate action)

Reduction in the climate and nature footprints of health products and interventions, to do less harm and save lives

Improved resilience of health systems to climate risks, contributing to sustainable and equitable access to health

Reduced public health burden of climate-related diseases and events

- \* "Do our part": Reduced greenhouse gas emissions of Unitaid's Secretariat and portfolio of investments, in line with UNFCC's Paris Agreement and net zero goals (50% reduction by 2030)
- Climate and health learning agenda developed and implemented, incl. disseminating learning widely externally and integrating into existing and future Unitaid work

# Reporting on the implementation of the Climate and Health strategy

- Progress reporting of the implementation of the Climate and Health strategy to the Executive Board will occur
  annually, in June each year, at the same time as the broader reporting on the implementation of Unitaid's 2023-2027
  Strategy.
- An important element will focus on presenting learning in the key areas identified in the Climate and Health strategy to enable the Secretariat to adjust its efforts for maximum impact and to enable the work of other partners.
- Additionally, there are important linkages between the Climate and Health work and the Strategic Objective Key
  Performance Indicators (e.g., climate-smart products will be captured under KPI 1.2 on portfolio health). Where
  relevant, these contributions and connections will be highlighted in the annual KPI reporting to the Executive Board.
- Climate and Health will also be integrated as a specific area of focus in the mid-term and end of term review of the Unitaid Strategy.
