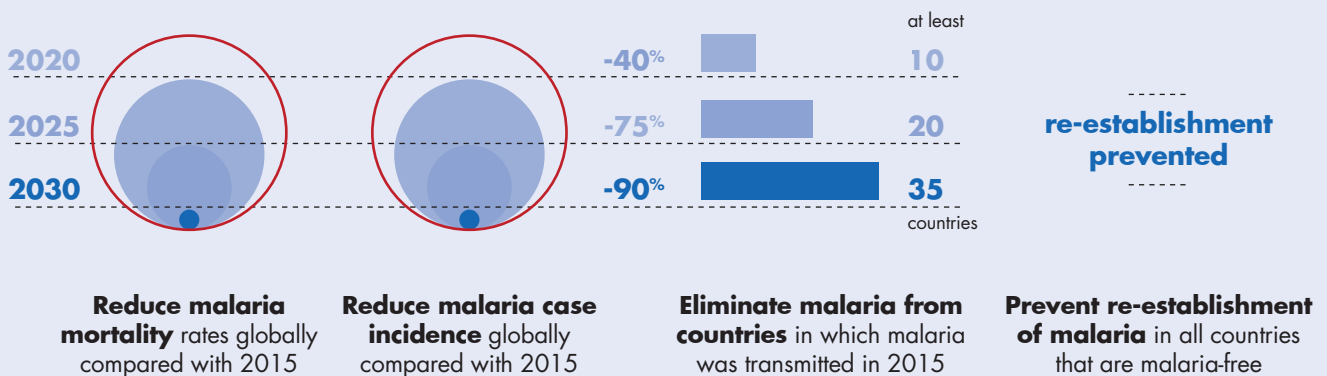

## HALF THE WORLD'S POPULATION IS AT RISK OF CONTRACTING MALARIA



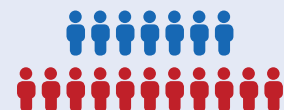
